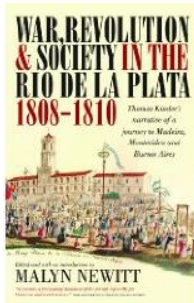


Revolution on paper:

**“WAR, REVOLUTION AND SOCIETY IN THE RIO DE LA PLATA, 1808-1810:
THOMAS KINDER’S NARRATIVE OF A JOURNEY TO MADEIRA, MONTEVIDEO
AND BUENOS AIRES”:**

Book Launch by Malyn Newitt, Emeritus Professor of History at King’s College.

Date: Thursday 11 March 5-7.30 pm

The book contains the narrative –published for the first time- of an English banker’s voyage to Buenos Aires and Montevideo in 1808-10.

His journey to the Río de la Plata followed the ill-fated British attempts to capture Buenos Aires in 1806-7. He obtained first hand information about the campaigns of Beresford and Whitelocke and became familiar with all the leading figures of the revolutionary period. His narrative constitutes a very significant first-hand commentary on the beginnings of the revolution in Montevideo and Buenos Aires and provides a detailed description of the economy and society of the two cities on the eve of their independence from Spain.
