

Xi'an's Terracotta Army, Day 7

Contrast China's Imperial and Communist heritage in Beijing with the booming capitalism embodied in Shanghai. Immerse yourself in magnificent scenery; hike along the Great Wall, around rice terraces and through karst landscapes. Come face-to-face with pandas, a Giant Buddha and the imposing Terracotta Army.

Days 1-5 Depart on overnight flight to Beijing, arriving the following day. Our special tour on Day 3 gives you an in-depth view of the the city's history, culture and modern life. We start amid the Communiststyle buildings of Tiananmen Square and walk into the mythical Forbidden City, home to 24 Chinese Emperors. Here you can learn about China's dynastic past, before climbing Coal Hill for an overview of the central Beijing landscape. After lunch in a traditional hutong, enter the Confucius and Buddhist temples to understand China's two most important belief systems and their role in daily life. (B,L) Day 4 at leisure or take an optional excursion. (B)


We now drive two hours north of Beijing on Day 5 to access the iconic Great Wall of China. Choose to hike a wild section to appreciate its full majesty and savour stunning views of the surrounding mountains, take the cable cars to the restored busier part at Mutianyu, or a combination of both. (B,L)

Days 6-8 Ride the Bullet Train to Xi'an, starting point of the ancient Silk Road. Day 7 see the 8,000 individually-carved members of the Terracotta Army, built to protect the tomb of China's first emperor. Later explore the Muslim Quarter, the Great Mosque and a traditional home, enjoying a local shadow puppet performance. (B,L) Day 8 at leisure in Xi'an or take an optional trip to see the famous Farm Painters of Huxian. (B)

Days 9-11 Our journey continues on the Bullet Train to Chengdu, with time at leisure to observe local life and drink tea in People's Park, visit the Buddhist Wenshu Monastery or wander along the bustling Jinli Street. Day 10, we visit the Panda Research Base in the morning to see baby pandas at their most active, with plenty of time to observe the cubs playing and see red pandas and black swans. Return to the city for midday, and spend the afternoon exploring the city. (B)

Days 12-13 We fly to Guilin and drive two hours through the mountains to the Longji Rice Terraces, staying in a minority village. En-route we visit the spectacular Reed Flute Caves, with ancient inscriptions and dramatic rock formations illuminated by colourful lighting. Day 13 we take an easy hike around the rice terraces, walking between spectacular viewpoints and learning about rural life and the unique customs of the people. Return to Guilin. (B,L)

Days 14-15 Enjoy a scenic cruise through the wonderful karst landscape along the Li River. On the way pass innumerable limestone peaks, shrouded in atmospheric mist, and observe locals tending their crops in the rice paddies. The cruise lasts for four hours and ends in the picturesque town of

Days 16-19 Fly to Shanghai in the morning, a city of vertiginous skyscrapers, lively street life and grand European heritage. On Day 17 our in-depth tour will introduce you to the historic buildings of the Bund, Xintiandi and the French Concession. There will be a short cruise on the Huangpu River to see the towers of Pudong up close and we will visit some classic Chinese gardens, an oasis of calm in the heart of Shanghai. (B,L)

Spend the day at leisure on Day 18, or take an optional excursion to the gardens of Suzhou or an ancient water town. On Day 19 fly home, arriving in the afternoon. (B)




Beijing is the cultural and historical heart of the People's Republic, where you can explore centuries of extraordinary history and observe modern life in a thriving 21st century China. It is therefore a natural starting point for any first-time visitors to the country.

In the courtyards of the 15th century Forbidden City, on the sacred steps of the Temple of Heaven and in the landscaped gardens of the Summer Palace, you can relive the might and majesty of the Dynastic years, when all-powerful emperors ruled over China.

The uncompromising communism of the Mao era is embodied in the Soviet-style buildings which line the vast Tiananmen Square. Venture into the hutong alleyways to find pockets of life largely untouched by the capitalism of recent years. The younger generation might be moving to the outskirts, but these streets are still home to older Beijingers, who rise early to take communal exercises in the park and who gather weekly to sing their 'red' songs.

But Beijing is not all about the past; microbreweries, contemporary hotels and the 798 Art District lend the city a young and dynamic edge, whilst Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism are embraced by the younger generations and celebrated in magnificent temples.

North of the city are several areas to access the Great Wall of China, both wild and restored sections.

Several parts of the legendary Great Wall of China can be accessed just north of Beijing on a memorable full day excursion. These range from reconstructed and easily-accessed areas to wilder and more atmospheric sections slightly further afield, or even a combination of both.

Xizhazi-Mutianyu This moderately challenging 6km hike begins with a walk up through a pine forest, then a climb up a short ladder. You will be rewarded with magnificent views of ruined and seldom seen sections of the Great Wall and the chance to walk in complete isolation. It also leads into Mutianyu, giving you a look at one of the very best restored parts.

Gubeikou Another unrestored and quieter part of the Great Wall, the full hike is roughly the same distance as Xizhazi-Mutianyu, but with easier access and more exit points. The views are equally as mesmerising and the atmospheric watchtowers will transport you back to the many great battles which took place here in ancient times. Mutianyu This popular restored section affords some great views and is larger and less-crowded than its more famous counterpart at Badaling. Cable cars make access easy and this option also affords time to visit the Ming Tombs on the way back to Beijing. For the more adventurous you can also descend via a specially-built toboggan.

Jinsbanling This partly restored section is another great place to experience the true majesty of the wall. Being further from Beijing, it is much quieter and more atmospheric than Mutianyu. This 4-5 hour hike is renowned for having some of the finest views in the region, with a wonderful collection of watchtowers. There are also cable cars for easier access.







What makes the Terracotta Army truly remarkable is the level of craftsmanship and detail of the soldiers and archers, each with their own individual facial expressions and features. Originally the men were all equipped with weapons and painted in vibrant colours, pigments of which can still be seen if you look closely enough. Located around 40 miles from Xi'an, the 8,000 strong army was built to protect the nearby tomb of the first emperor of the Qin dynasty and was accidentally discovered by local workers in the 1970s.

### Muslim Quarter

At the height of the Silk Road trade, Arabic and Persian merchants settled here to study and so began the city's Muslim community. Delve deep into the Muslim Quarter with a local guide and today much of Xi'an's long history, thriving local culture and varied cuisine can be discovered in the district's mosques, street markets and restaurants. It is a wonderful place to stroll the streets, try some of the local delicacies, barter for souvenirs and soak up the sights, smells and sounds of this vibrant corner of the ancient city of Xi'an.

The winding Li River is lined with mistshrouded limestone peaks. Along with traditional paddy fields worked by water buffaloes and farmers in cone-shaped hats, these create scenes that have inspired generations of artists and poets. This beauty can be enjoyed in Guilin and Yangshuo on boat trips, bamboo rafts, hikes or bike rides. In the evening the Illuminations Show lights up the river and cormorant fishermen demonstrate their ancient method, backed by the mysterious hills and the setting sun.

### Longji Rice Terraces

Layers of ancient terraces curve gracefully around steep hills like ribbons, creating one of China's most profoundly beautiful scenes. In spring the terraces are filled with reflective water, then turn green with the arrival of summer. They take on a golden palette of autumnal colours at harvest time, before winter brings snow. The terraces represent an extraordinary feat of engineering, an example of Chinese vision and ingenuity, whilst tiny minority villages preserve traditional customs and lifestyles.

of Yamdrok Lake then return to Lhasa to tour the Sera Monastery and observe resident monks holding their afternoon debates. (B,L)

Days 12-14 Flight to Chengdu. We begin Day 13 with a memorable visit to the Panda Research Base to observe giant pandas and their cubs. Afternoon at leisure perhaps to wander along Jinli Street or join the locals at one of the atmospheric teahouses. (B)

This contrast is best appreciated on the Bund waterfront, with grand buildings from yesteryear and sweeping views across the river to Pudong's gleaming towers. In the charming French Concession, traces of Shanghai's European influences remain, whilst the teahouse, temple and bazaar of Yu Gardens offer an oasis of peace.



Some of the most authentic and photogenic of the region are Tongli and Luzhi, near Suzhou, Zhujiajiao near Shanghai and Nanxun and Xitang, nearer to Hangzhou. A visit to these can be incorporated into your itinerary on a half or full day excursion with your local guide.

### Peaks of Huangshan

The Yellow Mountain's powerful granite peaks and oddly-shaped rocks soar above the clouds, creating arresting vistas that have inspired China's most noted painters and poets. We recommend taking the cable car (or perhaps hiking) to the summit and staying there overnight to enjoy the sunset and sunrise views. You can also combine the Yellow Mountain with the nearby ancient Hui villages, such as Tangmo, Xidi or Hongcun.



Travel to the Roof of the World to discover a sacred land of timeless monasteries, holy turquoise lakes and remote snow-capped Himalayan peaks.

So long off-limits and shrouded in mystery, Tibet is now attracting inquisitive travellers looking to experience the rich culture, traditional ways of life and magnificent landscapes of the high plateau. The holy monasteries and vacated palaces of Lhasa and Shigatse leave a profound impression, holding the keys to the past and offering a window on modern day life. Venture further afield to find turquoise lakes, dramatic mountain passes adorned with prayer flags and a flourishing river, along which herds of yaks graze and locals gather for afternoon picnics. Keep going south and you'll reach the fabled Everest Base Camp and glorious views of the world's highest peak.

#### Lhasa

Lhasa is the cultural, religious and historical centre of Tibet and, despite decades of Chinese rule, we still find Tibetan culture and Buddhism thriving in the beautiful old town. In the Barkhor, monks and devout pilgrims in traditional dress spin prayer wheels, or prostrate themselves on the floor as they circle the sacred street and enter the Jokhang Temple, the region's spiritual centre.

You don't have to wander far from here to soon be drinking sweet tea with the locals in a bustling teahouse, shopping for local handicrafts or sampling the rich Tibetan cuisine in a cozy family-kitchen restaurant.

In Lhasa we also find the poignant former palace residences of the Dalai Lama, where you can relive his daily routine and feel the ghosts of the past in deeply thought-provoking visits. Head to the 15th century Sera Monastery to see the resident monks take to the courtyard for their famous debating sessions and find scenic hills in which to hike through small forests to a remote numbers.

### Everest Base Camp

For intrepid travellers, venturing out of the capital to Everest Base Camp is a wonderful way to fully appreciate the natural beauty and rich cultural heritage of Tibet. The landscape on the way is characterised by sacred turquoise lakes, snow-capped mountain passes and rural yak herding communities, whilst the small cities of Shigatse and Gyantse offer timeless monasteries, among Tibet's most important.

The highlight of the journey is the magical moment that you get your first glimpse of Mount Everest as the early morning sun illuminates the world's highest peak.

To have the best chance of seeing Everest, you should stay close by - either in the simple Rongbuk monastery guesthouse, offering a small number of private rooms, or alternatively the spacious communal tents. Both sit at just under 5,000 metres above sea level and are a short shuttle bus ride from Base Camp. In the winter you can stay at a lower altitude in a small town and drive to Base Camp and back, with clear views all but guaranteed all day.

### Overnight train to Lhasa

A great way to reach Lhasa is by taking the scenic overnight train to the Tibetan capital. The journey starts at Xining, 2,275 metres above sea level, and passes the majestic Qinghai Lake soon after. It continues across the remote plains of the region, before you settle into your soft sleeper berth and awake to the glorious mountain landscapes of northern Tibet. The 22 hour journey ends in Lhasa at midday, now at 3,656 metres. The train is not luxurious, but is a comfortable way to see remote parts of the high plateau, build anticipation and slowly adjust to the altitude.

### Hiking in Tibet

A number of hiking routes allow you to immerse yourself in the raw beauty and nomadic culture of Tibet. A half-day option is the circular hike from Sera Monastery in Lhasa through forested hills to a remote nunnery and sky burial site. The most popular 4-5 day treks are the 50 mile pilgrimage route between Ganden and Samye monasteries and the 42 mile trek from Tingri to Everest Base Camp. On these you will be accompanied by porters, yaks and your experienced guide and all food will be prepared for you. Accommodation is a mix of camping and small guesthouses. These treks are rather demanding and at high altitude, so a good level of fitness and hiking experience is vital.



On Day 9 we start with a thought-provoking tour of the iconic Potala Palace before venturing into the heart of the old town to watch pilgrims circling the Barkhour, spinning prayer-wheels or prostrating themselves on the floor. Enter the sacred Jokhang Palace and enjoy fine views from its roof. After lunch, we tour the Sera Monastery and watch its famous afternoon debates among the monks. (B,L)

Days 10-11 Drive south via the sacred Yamdrok Lake and the Karola Glacier. Enter Gyantse's Pelkhor Monastery, famed for its Kumbum circular stupa, arriving in Shigatse early evening. (B,L) On Day 11 we start in the atmospheric Tashilhunpo Monastery, seat of the Panchen Lama (spiritual authority second only to the Dalai Lama) and see the world's largest gilded Buddha. Turning off the Friendship Highway to Nepal, we enter the Everest National Park. A winding road leads to the Kya Wu Lha mountain pass at 5,198m, offering a potentinal first glimpse of the Himalayas, Overnight in either the monastery guest house or large communal tents. (B,L,D)

Day 12 Rise early for glorious views as Everest is illuminated by the early morning sun. We take a short shuttle bus ride to walk around Everest Base Camp, before returning to Shigatse. En-route visit the Sakya

Monastery, known as the "Great Wall of Tibet" due to its rare fortress-like design. It is also noted for having the largest collection of prayer books in all of Tibet. (B,L)

Days 13-16 Fly to Chengdu. Next day we visit the Panda Research Centre in the morning to see baby pandas at their most active, returning to the city by noon. (B) Day 15 drive south to marvel at the 71m Leshan Giant Buddha, carved into the rock face. Climb the steps for a close-up view and enjoy a boat trip on the river, before returning to Chengdu. (B,L) Day 16 fly home via Amsterdam, arriving in the evening. (B)

Breathtaking scenery, charming old towns and an intoxicating mix of cultural identities combine to make Yunnan one of the most rewarding areas through which to travel in China. Combining the headline acts with some of the province's hidden gems offers the chance to explore the many cultures that coexist here and enjoy a cross-section of the most spectacular landscapes. Journeying along ancient caravan routes reveals remote monasteries, historic teahouses and isolated minority communities living a traditional way of life. ### Captivating cities

Most visitors' first contact with Yunnan is at its capital Kunming, known as the 'City of Eternal Spring' for its year-round temperate climate and blooming flowers. As well as being the base for visits to the Stone Forest, Kunming boasts an attractive central lake park and some impressive temples.

Dali is farmed for its ancient Three Pagodas, traditional Bai architecture, and stunning views of Erhai Lake. It is also close to fishing villages and minority Bai communities.

Lijiang is spectacularly located near yak meadows and the snow-capped Jade Snow Dragon peak. It has one of the country's best old towns; a maze of narrow alleyways and ancient waterways, rich in Naxi culture.

Further north is Shangri-la, named in honour of the mythical city. The old town remains the best place to experience Tibetan culture, outside the region itself. The city is also noted for the striking Guishan Temple and its proximity to areas of natural beauty.

### Natural Splendour

Yunnan's landscapes are as diverse as they are delightful. Among the most noted is the other-worldly **Stone Forest** near Kunming, where powerful limestone pillars rise side-by-side amid lakes, ponds, forests, caves, underground rivers and waterfalls.

The peaceful Erhai Lake at Dali is dotted with small islands which can be visited on boat trips. Further north, the Tiger Leaping Gorge and the Jade Dragon Snow Mountain both illicit a sense of awe and wonder on excursions from Lijiang.

Venture into the countryside near Shangri-la to reach thrilling canyons, national parks rich in biodiversity and powerful rivers carving their way through valleys.

Visited on an overnight stay from Lijiang is the majestic Lugu Lake, dotted with tiny islands and home to fascinating minority communities. Among these are the Mosuo people, who operate a rare matriarchal society in their so-called Kingdom of Women.



You are responsible for arriving at stated departure places and times and it is incumbent upon clients to behave in a responsible, restrai and sober manner when dealing with the local authorities, fellow travellers and our local suppliers and representatives.

By travelling on one of our tours, clients agree to accept the authority and decisions of the Company's employees, Tour Leaders and agents whilst on tour with the Company. If in the opinion of such persons of authority the health or conduct of a client at any time before or after departure appears likely to endanger the safe, comfortable and happy progress of a tour the client may be excluded from all or part of the tour. If a client commits any illegal act the client may be excluded from the tour and the Company shall cease to have responsibility to or for them.

Most problems can be sorted out straightaway if we know about them. If you have a complaint you must report it immediately to our staff, supplier, or local agent or representative, or the emergency contact telephone numbers provided with your travel documents, so that we can do our best to investigate and rectify the situation. Failure to inform us of a problem may effect your consumer right to compensation. If the problem cannot be resolved locally and you wish to complain full details must be sent in writing to: Customer Relations Department, Veloso Tours Ltd.

In the unlikely event that disputes arising out of, or in connection with, this contract cannot be amicably settled they may be referred to arbitration, if the customer so wishes, under a special scheme arranged by the Association of British Travel Agents, and administered independently by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. The scheme provides for a simple and inexpensive method of arbitration on documents alone with restricted liability on the customer in respect of costs. Full details will be provided on request or can be obtained from the ABTA website (www.abta.com).

The scheme does not apply to claims for an amount greater than £5,000 per person. There is also a limit of £25,000 per booking form. Neither does it apply to claims which are solely in respect of physical injury or illness or their consequences. The scheme can however deal with compensation claims which include an element of minor injury or illness, subject to a limit of £1,500 on the amount the arbitrator can award per person in respect of this element. The application for arbitration and Statement of Claim must be received by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators within nine months of the date of return from the holiday. Outside this time limit arbitration under the scheme may still be available if the Company agrees, but the ABTA Code does not require such agreement.

This contract and any matters arising from it are governed by the laws of England and Wales and are subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts of England and Wales. You may however, choose the law and jurisdiction of Scotland or Northern Ireland if you wish to do so.

China has a rapidly expanding tourist infrastructure, particularly with the large-scale expansion of its high speed Bullet Train network, shortening land transfer times between major cities. We offer a selection of luxury and reliable cruises along the Yangtze River and have selected the hotels, wherever possible, on the basis of their service, location, authenticity and character.

#### Cultural Differences

We have found throughout China that locals receive Western visitors warmly, often wanting to have their photographs alongside them

In major cities you may find that attitudes towards personal hygiene, politics, health and safety and personal space can differ to ours. These form part of the cultural differences which exist and it is important to have realistic expectations and a level of tolerance. Though as China develops its capitalist society, you will perhaps find that most of the younger generation actually share much in common with our way of life. China generally has a reputation as a safe place to visit for Western tourists, something largely borne out in our experiences.

Tibet is at high altitude, with the journey to Everest Base Camp reaching altitudes of over 5,000 metres. It is important that travellers are prepared for this and follow the instructions provided by the Traveller's Guide and your local host. In Tibet (indeed China as a whole) it is vital that travellers refrain from anything which could be deemed to be a political demonstration. Travelling with an open-mind will allow you better to understand the dynamics of the situation, come to your own conclusions and enjoy a trouble-free visit. Permits are required and a number of checkpoints exist in Tibet, however these will be handled by the guide with minimum disruption.

#### Accommodation

In selecting our hotels we have placed an emphasis on authenticity, character and location wherever possible. This is to enable you to enjoy a greater sense of identity and culture of China and immerse yourself in the heart of the city or within the diverse landscapes. Locally-run independent hotels are mixed with many recognisable international luxury hotels in the major cities.

In a small number of places it is not always possible to find hotels with character or 5 star standards in some of the towns and villages, or our first choice may not be available. In this case we use other hotels inspected which, in our opinion, provide a good level of comfort, facilities and service.

We have graded the hotels that we use as follows:

Deluxe Hotels are 5-star properties, ideally centrally located and with particular emphasis on the incorporation of traditional Chinese decor into spacious, modern and well-equipped rooms These hotels are renowned for their service. attention to detail and facilities, which may include spas and highly regarded restaurants.

First Class Hotels are 4-star standard, which offer a high degree of comfort and convenience. We look for well-presented rooms of a reasonable size, with private toilet and showering facilities, heating and a good standard of decor.
