The Amazon

The remaining two thirds of Brazil include the green, hilly state of São Paulo, the plains and beaches of the Northeast region, the Pantanal birdwatching sanctuary and the

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extensive waterfalls of Iguassú set in subtropical forest. The whole coastline is a series of glorious palm-fringed beaches, bays dotted with tropical islands, and secluded coves lined with lush forest.

PARATI web veloso.com/parati

Parati is a charming old colonial town, once the port for the Gold Route from Minas Gerais. The old town retains its original architecture with a fully pedestrianised centre and charming cobbled streets, white-washed houses with brightly painted windows. Several old houses have been converted into art galleries and craft shops, while characterful bars and restaurants offer locally caught fish delicacies. The bay is dotted with tropical islands whose shady forests reach right down to the sandy beaches, while old colonial forts look out from atop rocky outcrops. Take a boat trip to the islands, swim at idyllic beaches and snorkel in the clear waters.

Pousada Literaria Deluxe

Pousada Literaria occupies a large colonial-era house on the edge of the old town, fully renovated, modernised, and decorated with bright colours and Brazilian art. The atmosphere is relaxed and sociable, and reflects Parati's heritage of arts and culture. There is a swimming pool and large sun-deck in the internal courtyard, as well as a restaurant and connecting bookshop.

Casa Turquesa Deluxe

Located in the historic centre of Parati in front of the docks, Casa Turquesa combines charm and modernity with a fresh and bright colour palette. It has three bedrooms, dining/sitting room with veranda and maid/cook service.



Set on a hillside 30 minutes from Parati above a secluded bay, Picinguaba is a hideaway for those who want to be surrounded by lush forest. The decor is simple and colourful, with stylish touches. There is a pool, sun-deck and boat for daytrips, but the only beach is where local fishermen dry their nets.

Búzios, famous for its beaches and trendy lifestyle, is located two and a half hours from Rio de Janeiro. Dotted around the peninsula are numerous bays and coves with sandy beaches and crystal clear water.

The heart of Búzios is the popular Rua das Pedras, a cobbled street lined with glamorous boutiques, restaurants and bars with live music - a great place to hang out. Wealthy and glamorous South Americans come to their villas in Buzios to relax and socialise. It's a great place to enjoy a stroll along the waterfront past the colourful fishing boats.

Pedra da Laguna First

This charming pousada is located in Ponta da Lagoinha, near Ferradura Beach and not far from the village of Búzios itself. The hotel has a stylish decoration. and all rooms are equipped with air-conditioning, ceiling fan and a veranda, with a view out to the sea or to the surrounding hills. As the Iguassu river (Iguazu in Spanish) flows over a horseshoe shaped fault at the border between Argentina and Brazil, it produces a myriad of islands and waterfalls. The whole area is a National Park surrounded by forest with trails and wildlife. The Brazilian side offers the stunning panoramic view and the Argentinean side has three long walks: at the top of the falls, at the bottom along the riverbank and to the deepest, highest waterfalls.



Days 1-3 Arrival at Iguassu airport and transfer to your hotel staying for 2 nights. Afternoon tour of the Brazilian side offers the panoramic view with a long walkway by the river and highest waterfalls. Day 2 One full day on the Argentinian side you are on top of the falls with three trails to explore the stunning natural beauty and lush tropical setting. Time permitting you can take a boat trip on the river. Day 3 Departure transfer to the airport.

Bourbon First







The seasonal floodplain of the Pantanal is a paradise for birdwatchers and nature lovers. Each year the landscape of lowland savannah and dense forest is transformed as the water level rises to create vast areas of shallow lagoon where fauna congregates. These open expanses offer fantastic opportunities to watch magnificent array of wildlife that includes caiman, capybara, giant anteaters, macaws, toucans, ibis and storks. The lodges below provide transport, accommodation and excursion guides.

Rio Mutum

Situated in the northern region of the Pantanal, Pousada Rio Mutum is an ideal area to see tuiuiu (a type of stork), ibis, cormorant and various birds of prey, as well as caiman, tapir, monkey, deer and capybara - or perhaps the more elusive jaguar, giant anteater and otter.

The pousada has 16 air conditioned rooms with private facilities, including full board with an excellent choice of regional dishes and daily guided excursions. (*B*,*L*,*D*)

There is a swimming pool and a full programme of daily excursions accompanied by an English-speaking naturalist guide to observe the Pantanal's prolific birdlife, animals and vegetation.





THE NATURAL WORLD

Brazil's Natural World focuses on wildlife and the environment, contrasting the prolific birdlife of the Pantanal wetlands, the exuberant vegetation of the Amazon rainforest and the vestiges of the Atlantic coastal forest. In the modern, cosmopolitan cities of Rio de Janeiro and Salvador, colonial and African heritage come together to create the country's unique identity.

Day 1 Morning departure on a flight to Rio de Janeiro, arriving in the evening. Transfer to your hotel for 3 nights and brief guided introductory orientation walk of the area surrounding the hotel. (B)

Day 2 Full day tour of Rio including the statue of Christ the Redeemer high on Corcovado mountain, the Imperial Palace, the Cathedral and the bustling old colonial centre. (*B*,*L*)

Day 3 Full day tour to the Botanical Gardens and the Atlantic coastal forest at Tijuca, with a cable car trip up Sugar Loaf to see the sunset over the city. (*B,L*)

Days 4-6 Fly to Cuiaba in the **Pantanal** staying at Rio Mutum Lodge for 3 nights. Enjoy the pool in the midday heat and daily guided excursions for birdwatching and explore the rich ecosystem created by seasonal flooding (*B*,*L*,*D*)

Journey along small rivers to Turtle Lodge, remote in the rainforest (see page 62). Daily guided excursions include forest walks under the dense canopy, a visit to a local family and excursions by canoe through the maze of islands and waterways. (B,L,D)

Day 11 Return to Manaus for a flight on to **Salvador da Bahia**, then transfer to a hotel in the colourful colonial district of Pelourinho, now a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site. The unique fusion of Portuguese and African influences is visible at every turn. (B).

Days 12-14 Morning tour of Salvador then transfer to Praia do Forte on the coast whose empty beaches are lined with

Caiman Lodge

The Fazenda Caiman Lodge is a 50,000 hectare cattle and ecological preservation estate, 4 hours drive from Campo Grande in the Southern Pantanal. You can view caimand, capivaras and a wide variety of birds. Many times the highlight is to track Jaguars with a high probability of viewing these magnificent and elusive felines. There is a pool to enjoy and swim during the warm mid-day period between the early in the morning and late afternoon excursions. The rooms are comfortable with character decoration in tune with the Pantanal region, private facilities and a veranda with a hammock. There is also a sitting room with large windows onto the surrounding countryside and a dining room. All meals and excursions are included. The Caiman Lodge is modelled on African safari lodges, with open vehicles for the excursions and excellent guides to show you the local eco-system.

Baia Grande

The Fazenda Baía Grande is a cattle and ecological tourism estate, owned and managed by a family that has lived in the Pantanal for 150 years, always linked to the land, the preservation of the environment and the local culture. The lodge is small, for a maximum of 15 guests and has a cosy and genuinely friendly atmosphere. Each room has a bathroom with a shower, hot water, air conditioning, and all the windows are protected with mosquito nets to ensure you have a comfortable sleep. All meals are included catering to all tastes including vegetarians. The main activities included are bird watching, horse riding, wildlife observation, nightime caiman spotting, piranha fishing and hiking. After the excursions you can rest in a hammock or enjoy the swimming pool. This is a lodge to enjoy the nature, read a good book and to rest. (B,L,D)

Amazon Lodge

The journey to and from the lodge is a fascinating view of the Amazon, gradually getting away from people into a remote region of pristine rainforest, three hours south of Manaus. You take a boat across the mighty Amazon river, seeing the well defined line of the famous "meeting of the waters". Continue by road to a small tributary river to board a motorised canoe to the lodge. The Amazon Eco-Lodge is a comfortable lodge built from wood and local materials, in a star shape and floating on the calm waters. It has a central unit with an open lounge and dinning room on the first floor, and 16 bedrooms, all with private facilities. Guided excursions by boat and on foot to trek in the forest, visit a local homesteads and spotting wildlife.

Venture deep into pristine rainforest on Lake Juma. The journey is a sightseeing tour in itself: first you cross the wide Amazon by launch, passing the Meeting of the Waters where the silt-laden Rio Solimoes meets the dark, clear waters of the Rio Negro to form the Amazon. Then, after a short trip by road, you board a motorised canoe for the trip along the Rio Araca, getting ever further away from civilisation, to reach a secluded area where the seasonal rise and fall of the waters creates narrow, twisting creeks and a maze of small islands covered in virgin rainforest.

Juma Lodge

Located far from Manaus, on a riverbank and in an area of pristine, virgin rainforest. The lodge is a complex of cabins spaced out within the forest and connected by a network of walkways. All built in wood and thach, the secluded rooms have private facilities and a small balcony overlooking the forest and the water. Includes daily guided excursions in the rainforest, local families and caiman spotting at night.



Located three hours from Manaus, on the shore of a small river and sufficiently far to be in an area of pristine, virgin rainforest. The lodge, built in local wooden style with thatched roofs, consists of one main building with sitting room and a dining area on the first floor with open sides for a panoramic view of the forest and river. There are five bungalows with two rooms each, all with private facilities, netting and a veranda overlooking the river. Includes daily guided excursions in the rainforest, local families and caiman spotting at night.

Day 1 Depart from Manaus for the three to four hour transfer by land and motorised canoe to a remote **Amazon** lodge, set in a maze of creeks and islands in the vast rainforest. Relax in peace and tranquility that is broken only by the sounds of wildlife hidden in the dense forest surrounding the lodge and perhaps take a paddlings canoe on the river. Dinner and overnight. (*L*,*D*)

Days 2-5 Experience the forest at close quarters with a skilled guide and support staff who organise all transport, camp with mosquito nets and all meals. We set out by canoe to a rustic base shelter in the Amazon rainforest where we sleep in hammocks covered by mosquito nets. In this stress-free environment there are no timetables and the outside world fades into insignificance. From this base we take several walks in the gloom of the

forest under the dense canopy, where trees fight for survival and a glimpse of sunlight, and the main danger is getting lost. We learn about all aspects of the rich ecosystem, and the symbiosis of its flora and fauna. Visit a local family to see their daily activities, and learn how they live by cultivating bananas, manioc and tropical fruits. At high water level we paddle canoes through flooded forest creeks, weaving between the tree trunks. (*B,L,D*)

Days **5-6** Return to the lodge for a night before heading back to Manaus. (*B*)

Amazon Ecopark Lodge

This comfortable lodge is located in a preserved area of forest only 30 minutes by boat from Manaus. It thus provides an ideal introduction to the Amazon, while ensuring that most creature comforts are still on hand. However its proximity to the city means that the rainforest is disturbed by human activity and the glow of city lights in the background is always visible.

There is a panoramic open-air restaurant, built in local style from local materials, where you can enjoy delicious regional cuisine as well as international dishes; there is also a bar and a sitting area.

Accommodation consists of 20 spacious bungalows each with three comfortable rooms - all with private facilities (hot water shower), screened windows, air conditioning and fan. As well as taking excursions into the rainforest, you can enjoy swimming and sunbathing at the private river beach. There is also a natural freshwater pool, several kilometres of hiking trails, many orchids, a bird sanctuary, a monkey reserve on an island, and the nearby Tortoise Lake.

M/Y Tucano



This river trip explores some of the least touched rainforest in the Amazon region, entering a seldom visited area to seek out the wildlife that few visitors ever see.

Built in the style of a nineteenth century riverboat, the M/Y Tucano is an expedition boat which has nine air conditioned outside cabins spead over three decks with a mixture of lower and upper berths; all cabins have private facilities with hot water showers, wooden panelling and large windows. The top

deck is partly open, with a shaded area at the stern, while the middle deck has a spacious forward-facing saloon with a wide balcony. The Tucano accommodates 18 passengers plus a crew of seven that includes a naturalist guide to accompany all excursions in electric powered canoes.

Voyage to the Heart of the Amazon

Day 1 Morning departure from Manaus up the Rio Negro river to explore the world's largest river island system, the Anavilhanas Archipelago, a myriad of islands and channels covered in forest, with some isolated settlers and home to pink river dolphin and exotic birds. (L,D)

Day 2 Early morning trip to seekhowler monkeys and toucans, followed by a forest walk. Cruise on with time for an afternoon swim. (*B*,*L*,*D*)

Day 3 Travel during the day with stops for excursions ashore. (*B*,*L*,*D*)

Day 4 Sail along the heavily forested riverbank, scouting for wildlife. Visit a settler's home and continue to the pristine river, Rio Jauaperi, an area of virgin rainforest known locally as varzea. Night excursion to see wildlife. (*B*,*L*,*D*)

Day 5 Rejoin the Rio Negro, sailing downstream, with excursions on foot and by boat, plus another night excursion to seek out nocturnal wildlife. We travel through the night to the confluence of the Rio Negro with the Solimoes. (*B,L,D*)

Day 6 Explore Lago Janauari Ecological Park, a good area to observe wildlife. Travel to the Meeting of the Waters where the silt-laden waters of the Solimoes run alongside the clear, dark waters of the Rio Negro for several kilometres due to their different densities. In the evening return to Manaus and overnight onboard. (B,L,D)

Day 7 Morning disembarkation and departure. (B)

Next day we visit the statue of **Christ the Redeemer**, perched on Corcovado mountain, granting fabulous views of the city, lagoon and beaches, and we visit the historic Royal Palace and Cathedral. The Iguassu waterfallss, Days 4–5

Day 4 Fly to Foz do Iguassu to visit the spectacular waterfalls which are made of numerous smaller falls along a span of 2,470m. We visit the Brazilian side for a panoramic view, then we transfer to the Argentinian side, for a perpective from above and walks along the trails. Spend one night at our hotel overlooking the falls. (B)

Days 5-7 Fly to Buenos Aires and we visit this city, dubbed the 'Paris of South America'. We pass through the colourful quarter of La Boca, birthplace of the tango, and the main square with the Presidential Palace, finishing at the elegant Parque de Recoleta with its smart bars and street cafés. Time at leisure to explore or watch a tango show in bohemian San Telmo. (B)

Day 8 Fly to Santa Cruz in Bolivia and stay overnight at leisure and sightseeing. (B)

Day 9 Fly to Sucre, an attractive, temperate city, with numerous museums and where buildings retain their colonial charm, preserving the traditional white façades. Afternoon tour of the city. (B)

Day 10 Full day excursion to **Tarabuco** market, where locals, dressed in their unique costumes, sit behind pyramids of coca leaves and fruit, whilst others sell their traditional woven goods. (*B*,*L*)

Day 11 Our day begins with a journey to **Potosí.** Towering over the city, **Cerro Rico** is an imposing mountain whose wealth of precious metals, have been mined in poor conditions since colonial times, leading to a "devil worhip". Afternoon visit of the city, old Spanish **Mint** and return to Sucre. (*B*)

Days 12-13 Transfer to Sucre airport and fly to La Paz, the world's highest capital city (3,636m). Stay for 2 nights. A bustling city settled in a large basin, where adobe houses cling precariously to the sheer sides. Our tour of the city follows a maze of streets and alleyways, leading us to the witches' market, where indigenous ladies sell colourful potions to cure all ills. (B)

Day 14 Journey to Lake Titicaca, cross the straits of Tiquina and drive along the lake shore with the snow-capped mountains in the background. 



Continuing to the mountain kingdom of the Incas, high in the Andes, we visit their imperial capital of Cusco and the remote citadel of Machu Picchu.

Machu Picchu Days 16-17



Days 1-3 Daytime flight to Quito on Tuesday (First) or Saturday (Tourist) depending on the Galapagos cruise yacht chosen. On arrival you will be met and taken to your hotel staying for 3 nights. Situated between two ranges of the snowcapped Andes, Quito's setting is beautiful. The next morning we take a tour of the modern and colonial quarters including La Compañía Church with its ornate façade and a visit to the Archaeological Museum, housing a fascinating collection of pre-Colombian ceramics and gold. Excursion to Otavalo market where local people trade produce, weavings and we admire the mountain countryside. (B)

Days 4-10 Cruise the Galapagos Islands, where Darwin observed the wildlife that would lead him to his theory of evolution. Spend 7 nights cruising the archipelago on the M/Y Beluga (First) or M/Y Samba (Tourist) with daily morning and afternoon guided walks to admire the tame wildlife endemic in each island. Basking marine and land iguanas, red and blue footed boobies. frigate birds, giant tortoises, and friendly sea lions abound. Please refer to pages 128 -137 for details of yachts available. (B,L,D)

Days 11-12 Flight back to the mainland connecting with a flight to Lima staying for 2 nights. The following day we explore Lima, visiting the main squares, surrounded by grand colonial buildings, the Anthropological Museum with its fascinating array of textiles, pottery and mummies spanning from 1400 BC to Hispanic time, and the Larco Herrera Museum, with a lovely garden, cafe and a large collection of randomly arranged treasures including Inca gold artifacts. (B)

Day 13 Continue with a flight to Cusco staying for 3 nights. On arrival you are met and have the afternoon free to acclimatise to altitude or walk to the main square to absorb the local atmosphere. (B)

Day 14 A fascinating, half day excursion of Cusco and the ruins surrounding the city. Within Cusco, the evidence of Inca culture is visible in the Cathedral, churches and numerous buildings erected on solid Inca stonework foundations. Outside the city stands the fortress of Sacsayhuamán, whose stones weigh over 100 tons and are fitted together with Inca precision. (B)

The Encantada Tour departs Thursday,

affording great views of the valleys and Inca terracing. Stop at the Maras salt pans, on to Pisac market, a colourful show of local foods and weavings, and visit Pisac ruins, remains of some of the finest examples of Inca masonry. Continue to the village of Ollantaytambo, with its ancient irrigation system, still in good working order, and with the ancient Inca temple fortress towering above. (B,L)

Day 16 Set off by Vistadome train on a glorious journey trundling along the course of the Urubamba River to Aguas Calientes. (See page 106) Bus up to the mountain to the magnificent **Machu Picchu ruins**. Guided tour of the archaeological site explaining its history. Afternoon free to explore at leisure. Overnight. (*B*,*L*)

Day 17 Early morning offers an excellent opportunity to go back for a quiet stroll around Machu Picchu, a walk along the Inca Trail to the Sun Gate, or a strenuous climb to Huayna Picchu, the rocky escarpment overlooking the ruins. Afternoon return to Cusco, by Vistadome train and transfer to your hotel. (B)
